Deciphered Reading Passage

Sometimes phonemic awareness is confused with phonics; they are two different yet related skills. Phonemic awareness refers to spoken language. It is the understanding that the sounds of spoken language work together to make words. Phonics refers to the alphabetic principle. This is about how letters represent sounds. Children who can't hear and work with phonemes will have problems learning how to relate phonemes to letters when they see them in print.
